

JOHN 2:1-11

Water into Wine

But then, a problem happened — the wine ran out. For the family hosting the wedding, this was very embarrassing. Mary, Jesus' mother, came to Him and said, "They have no more wine."


Jesus told her, "It is not yet My time." Still, Mary trusted Him. She told the servants, "Do whatever He tells you."



When the master tasted it, he was amazed! The water had turned into the best wine he had ever tasted. He said, "Usually people

serve the best wine first, and later bring out the cheaper wine. But you have saved the best until now!"

This was the very first miracle Jesus did. It showed His power and made His disciples believe in Him even more.

When He finished speaking, Jesus turned to Peter and said, "Take the boat into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch."


Peter sighed. "Master, we worked hard all night and caught nothing. But because You say so, I will let down the nets."

One day, Jesus and His disciples got into a boat to cross the lake. Jesus was very tired, so He lay down and fell fast asleep.


Suddenly, a furious storm swept over the water. The waves crashed against the boat, and it began to fill with water. The disciples were terrified.

But Jesus replied, "They don't need to go away. You give them something to eat."


The disciples looked at each other in surprise. "But we only have five loaves of bread and two fish!" they said.



Peter said, "Lord, if it's really You, tell me to come to You on the water."


"Come," Jesus said.

The disciples answered, "Where could we get enough bread in this lonely place to feed such a crowd?"


"How many loaves do you have?" Jesus asked.


"Seven loaves, and a few small fish," they replied.

One day, Jesus and His disciples went to the town of Capernaum. There, some men came to Peter and asked, "Does your teacher pay the temple tax?"


"Yes, He does," Peter replied.


When Peter went into the house, Jesus spoke first. "What do you think, Simon?" He asked. "Do kings collect taxes from their own children, or from others?"


Jesus Withers the Fig Tree

They did as He said, and suddenly the net was so full of fish they could not pull it in!




When they landed, they saw a fire with fish cooking on it, and some bread. Jesus said, "Bring some of the fish you have just caught."

Jesus went to Cana in Galilee, the place where He had turned water into wine. There was a royal official in the town of Capernaum whose young son was very sick.


When the man heard that Jesus had come, he hurried to Him and begged, "Sir, please come to my house before my child dies!"


Jesus Heals Peter's Mother-in-Law


Jesus Heals Many in Capernaum

Jesus Heals a Man with Leprosy



Jesus Heals the Centurion's Servant


[Editor's Note: In Luke's Gospel, the centurion sends elders instead of coming personally.]

Jesus Heals a Bleeding Woman



When Jesus went into a house, the blind men came to Him there. Jesus asked them, "Do you believe that I am able to do this?"


"Yes, Lord," they replied.


Then Jesus touched their eyes and said, "According to your faith let it be done to you."


When Jesus saw her, He called her forward and said, "Woman, you are set free from your sickness."

But the synagogue leader was upset. He said to the people, "There are six days for work. Come and be healed on those days, not on the Sabbath."



In front of Jesus was a man suffering from dropsy, a sickness that made his body swollen.


Jesus asked the Pharisees and teachers of the law, "Is it right to heal on the Sabbath or not?"


When Jesus saw them, He said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests."


As they went on their way, they were healed! Their leprosy was gone, and their skin was made clean.

As Jesus and His disciples were leaving the city of Jericho, a large crowd followed them.


A blind man named Bartimaeus was sitting by the roadside. When they heard that Jesus was passing by, they shouted, "Lord, Son of David, have mercy on us!"


Jesus Heals the High Priest's Servant's Ear


Late at night, soldiers and officials came to arrest Jesus in the garden. His disciples were afraid, but one of them quickly pulled out a sword.

When Jesus saw him lying there, He asked, "Do you want to get well?"


"Sir," the man replied, "I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else always goes down ahead of me."


Then Jesus said to him, "Get up! Pick up your mat and walk."

Jesus answered, "It was not because of his sin or his parents' sin. This happened so that the works of God might be seen in him."


Then Jesus spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and spread it on the man's eyes. He told him, "Go, wash in the Pool of Siloam."

One day, Jesus came to the town of Bethsaida. Some people brought a blind man to Him and begged Jesus to touch him.


Jesus took the man by the hand and led him outside the village. He gently spit on the man's eyes and placed His hands on him. Then Jesus asked, "Do you see anything?"


The man looked up and said, "I see people, but they look like trees walking around."


So Jesus touched the man's eyes again. This time, his eyes were fully opened, and his sight was completely restored! He could see everything clearly.

"Be quiet!" Jesus said firmly. "Come out of him!"


The evil spirit shook the man violently and came out of him with a loud cry.





Jesus healed him so that he could both talk and see.


The crowd was amazed. They said, "Could this be the Son of David?"


But the Pharisees, who did not believe in Jesus, said, "It is only by Beelzebul, the prince of demons, that this man drives out demons."

Jesus Heals a Mute Man


While Jesus was speaking, some people brought to Him a man who could not talk because he was possessed by a demon.

Jesus Heals a Boy with an Unclean Spirit




Jesus said, "You unbelieving and stubborn generation! How long shall I stay with you? Bring the boy here to Me."

Jesus said, "I was sent only to the lost sheep of Israel."


But the woman came closer and knelt before Him. "Lord, help me!" she pleaded.

The crowd laughed at Him, because they did not believe.


After the people were sent outside, Jesus went into the room, took the girl by the hand, and she got up!

As they came near the town gate, they saw a funeral procession. A young man had died—the only son of a widow. She was crying, and many people from the town were with her to comfort her.


When Jesus saw her, His heart was filled with compassion. He said to her, "Don't cry."


Then He went up and touched the coffin. The people carrying it stopped. Jesus said, "Young man, I say to you, get up!"


The women hurried away from the tomb, filled with fear and great joy, and ran to tell the disciples.


Then, something amazing happened.


As Jesus was speaking, He began to rise up into the sky! The disciples watched in wonder as He went higher and higher, until a cloud hid Him from their sight.


They stood there, staring into the sky.
