

- Certificate of Completion: When you've finished, claim your very own certificate celebrating your journey through Namibia Kids Explorer.





Namibia.



Namibia is one of the driest countries in sub-Saharan Africa, with an average annual precipitation of just 283.6 mm (about 11 inches) measured from 1901 to 2023.

Over 70 percent of the country receives less than 400 mm of rain per year—the bare minimum for dryland farming—while the wettest northeastern regions can see 500–600mm annually

Within 40 km of the Atlantic coast, average rainfall is under 20 mm per year, and falls on just a few stormy days

Most of Namibia's rain falls during the "green" season from November through April, arriving as short but often intense afternoon thunderstorms.

When the rains come, the vast Etosha Pan can flood, turning into a shallow lake over 6 000 km², drawing thousands of birds and wildlife to drink

These patterns—with long, bone-dry periods punctuated by sudden summer showers—shape Namibia's unique ecosystems and make every drop of rain an exciting event!














FUN FACTS FROM THE NAMIB DESERT

FOG


Some areas of the Namib Desert receive very little rain, but fog from the Atlantic Ocean helps provide moisture.








